

Who is eligible for EOP&S?

In order for a student to be considered eligible for EOP&S the following criteria applies:

- 1. Be a resident of California or AB540
- 2. Qualify for a Board of Governors Waiver (BOGW)
- Be educationally disadvantaged (in one or more area listed below):
 - Not recommended to enroll in degree applicable English or Math classes,
 - Does not have a high school diploma or GED,
 - High School G.P.A. below 2.5
 - Previously enrolled in remedial English or Math classes
- Be enrolled full-time (12 units)
- 5. Must not have completed more than 45 units of degree applicable credit coursework in any combination of postsecondary higher education institutions



How do I apply?

- Complete & submit an EOP&S application to the EOP&S office in L107.
- Apply for admission to PCC (application available online).
- 3. Apply for a BOG fee waiver
- Complete and file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
