Grant Will Focus On Aiding Mobility For Children in Foster Care in LA County

October 15, 2018 --- Court Appointed Special Advocates of Los Angeles (CASA of LA) is proud to announce that it has received a grant of \$125,000 from General Motors as part of its mobility initiative. Currently, CASA of LA has over 950 advocates serving over one thousand children in Los Angeles County's child welfare system per year. "It's hard enough for these kids to get new clothes each year, let alone have reliable transportation to see loved ones, get to dialysis, or get a ride to an activity the rest of us take for granted.
