DEAR FRIENDS,

This past year, CASA of Los Angeles embarked on a journey of continued commitment and innovation in advocating for the well-being of children within LA County's child welfare and juvenile justice systems, alongside their families. Our dedicated staff, volunteers, board members, and supporters collaborated to redefine our approach, introducing new ways to reach more children through one-to-one advocacy, redefining our programs, and expanding our marketing efforts to increase and diversify our volunteer base. Strengthening community ties and tirelessly advocating for systems change remained at the forefront of our work.

Aligned with our supporters and partners, CASA/LA successfully served 1004 children in FY2024 through our 832 Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA volunteers). Our incredible CASA volunteers closed advocacy cases for 421 children, with many experiencing positive life-affirming outcomes, including reunification with their families, transitions to less restrictive placements, enrollment in suitable educational settings, and access to essential medical, emotional, and educational resources:

- 188 children moved to a more permanent placement
- 219 children were connected to specialized program or activity to support mental health and well-being
- 39 youth graduated high school or completed their GED or certificate of completion
- 235 children had increased time or connection with family members
- 112 children showed academic improvement or increased attendance in school

As we step into the coming year, we are filled with enthusiasm and gratitude, which fuels us to persist in this essential work in collaboration with this steadfast, passionate community. Acknowledging that there is still more to accomplish, we remain confident that our united efforts will play a significant role in making Los Angeles a more robust, secure, and enriched community for all.

From all of us at CASA of Los Angeles, we thank you for your support and look forward to continuing our great work in the coming year.

MILESTONES **FY2024**



This fiscal year, 790 youth achieved permanency goals:

- 57 children/youth were placed back in home of parent or have an identified adopted home
- 145 children/youth had moved to a more appropriate placement
- 45 children/youth had initial or increased liberalized me with family and/or personal connections
- 76 children/youth/NMDs connected or reconnected with a family-like or significant adult
- 153 TAY/NMDs achieved a significant milestone including sign up a checking or savings account, getting connected to ILP services, obtaining employment and CA ID, and/or securing housing.

This fiscal year, 219 youth achieved physical health goals:

- 24 children/youth received a prescription for needed medication, necessary medical equipment (i.e. glasses, insulin pump, wheelchair, etc.) and/or a needed medical procedure/surgery.
- 21 children/youth were connected to a specialized medical service (i.e. nutritionist, physical therapy, reproductive health, gender-affirming treatment, and orthodontia)

MILESTONES **FY2024**

This fiscal year, 219 youth achieved physical health goals:

- 58 children/youth were connected to activities/programs/resources/equipment of the child/youth's choice that support emotional well-being (i.e. prosocial activities, extracurricular activities, art supplies, music equipment, etc.)
- 39 children/youth changed to a more appropriate mental health provider
- 38 children/youth/NMDs were connected to a specialized therapist or program (i.e. EMDR, equine therapy, LGBTQIA+ focused, grief resources, dyadic therapy) and/or a substance abuse treatment program
- 20 children/youth had decreased connection to mental health services due to clinical need (i.e. decreased hours, less intensive services, meeting therapeutic goals, graduating from services)

This fiscal year, 693 youth achieved education goals:

GENERAL EDUCATION MILESTONES

- 44 children/youth had an IEP or 504 plan or assessment completed
- 27 children/youth had an educational rights holder appointed
- 39 children/youth had been connected to educational services or support, including tutoring, college readiness,
- 1:1 aide, school based counseling, or services not through an IEP
- 56 children/youth/NMDs had been connected to or provided with technology needed for education support
- 112 children/youth had increased attendance, showed academic improvement and/or showed behavioral improvement in school
- 52 children/youth transitioned to a more appropriate educational setting

POST SECONDARY EDUCATION MILESTONES

- 22 youth/NMDs were connected to services on their college campus (i.e. office for foster youth, academic support, reasonable accommodation)
- 6 youth/NMDs were awarded financial aid or a scholarship
- 43 youth/NMDs enrolled in a post-secondary education program (i.e. community college, vocational or trade school, university)
- 39 youth/NMDs graduated from either their education program (i.e. high school, HiSET/GED) or a post-secondary education program



CASA of Los Angeles **FY2024 IMPACT**



For over 40 years, CASA/LA has been the only organization in Los Angeles County providing court appointed advocates to youth in the child welfare system helping these children navigate the trials of the courtroom, and also the trials of a challenged childhood.

The CASA program is a proven, reliable and economic model of support that is the difference between success and failure for thousands of children. Many more children would thrive if they had the intensive intervention of a CASA volunteer.

SPOTLIGHT / VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Each year, CASA/LA solicits nominations from attorneys, hearing officers, and DCFS staff for our highest volunteer award: Volunteer of the Year. This year, we received more nominations than ever, but ultimately, our committee decided to honor CASA Rachel Quaintance for going above and beyond in her advocacy work.

At the start of 2023, Rachel was still working on a previous case when she met then 12-year-old Ava in the course of volunteering with her dog at a short term residential therapeutic program (STRTP). Rachel immediately contacted her supervisor to try to get Ava a CASA referral, and soon enough, Rachel was appointed as Ava's CASA.

Rachel's first priority was to work on getting Ava out of the STRTP. Ava was in the process of moving towards reunification with her mother, and so Rachel worked on building a relationship not only with Ava, but with her mother as well. Other adults on Ava's team seemed stuck on the mom's past and Rachel would often say, "If we want reunification, we have to look forward, not back." Both Ava and her mother had been working hard to make the reunification happen and that's what mattered. Rachel cut through the bureaucracy, held people accountable, and ultimately, Ava was able to be placed back with her mother. Unfortunately, the situation was further complicated by Ava's mental health issues.

Mental health has been one of Ava's biggest struggles throughout her childhood. Rachel knew she needed to build trust to better understand and support Ava's mental health needs. Like the assumptions Rachel faced about Ava's mom, she saw that some adults who were supposed to help Ava instead labeled her mental health issues as "bad behaviors" or manipulation. Rachel is glad she was there to say, "This is a child who lost her parental attachment at 6 and has legitimate mental health issues. She's doing all the hard work to improve her mental health—what are the adults doing?" When Ava had a mental health crisis and needed to be removed from her mother's care again, Rachel was there to help her manage that devastating transition and advocate for her when Ava could not. Ava was placed back in an STRTP for "emergency shelter care," but DCFS seemed ready to keep her there indefinitely. Rachel stayed persistent until DCFS found a resource home for Ava. She is now doing well with a great caregiver as she works toward reunification with her mother.

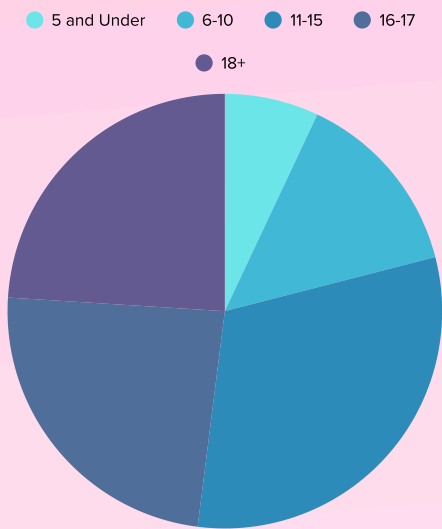


In the meantime, Rachel has been researching different diagnoses and treatments and has even been able to connect Ava to equine therapy and enriching after-school activities. Rachel says that she is constantly asking herself, "If this were my child, what would I do?" Reflecting on Ava's progress in the context of all that she's been through, Rachel shared, "She is a light in this world; I'm so proud of her."

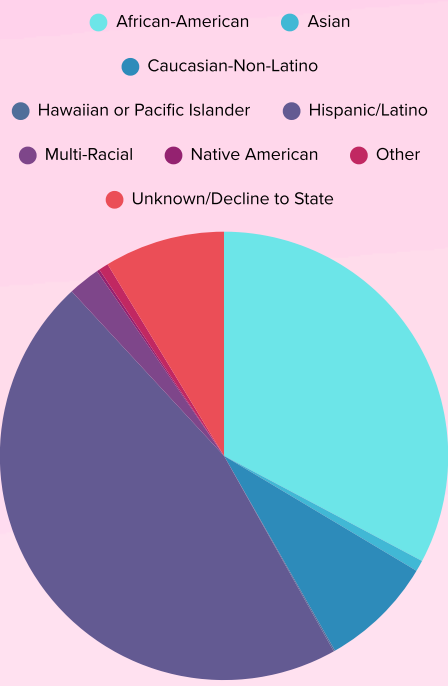
Rachel never could have imagined the impact becoming a CASA would have on all aspects of her life. She now talks to everyone she knows about her CASA work, tapping into her networks to find resources, and bringing awareness about our broken systems to people who may never have otherwise gotten this kind of exposure. Her mentality is: "we can't go back in time and change the history in this country, all we can do is say, 'how do we fix this now?'"

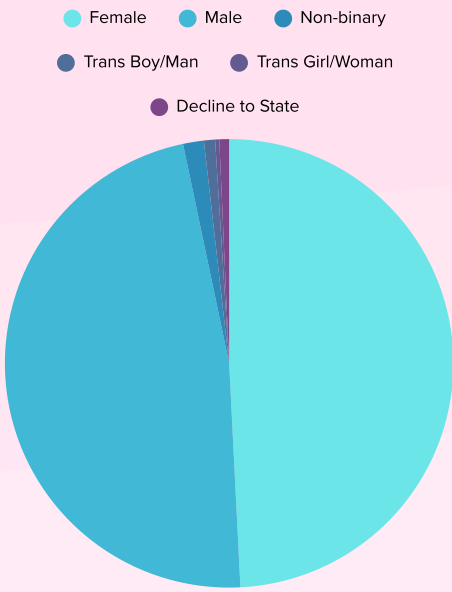
AGE



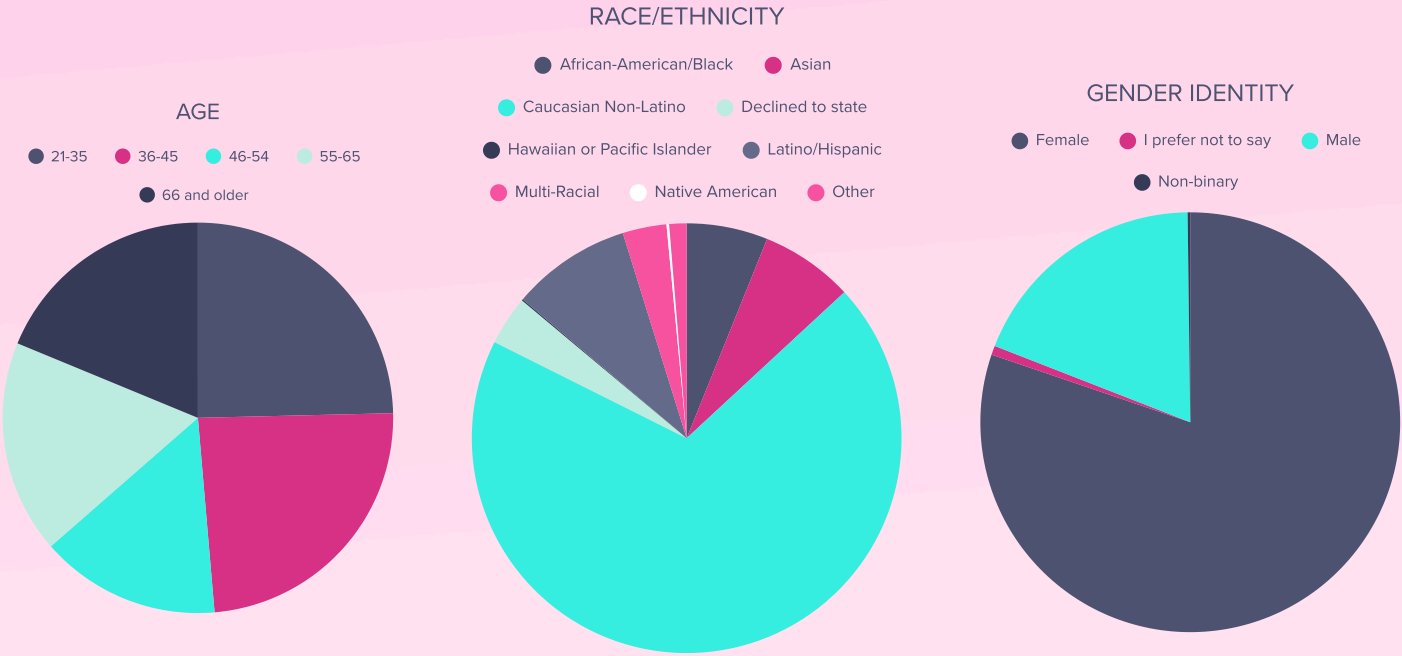
RACE/ETHNICITY

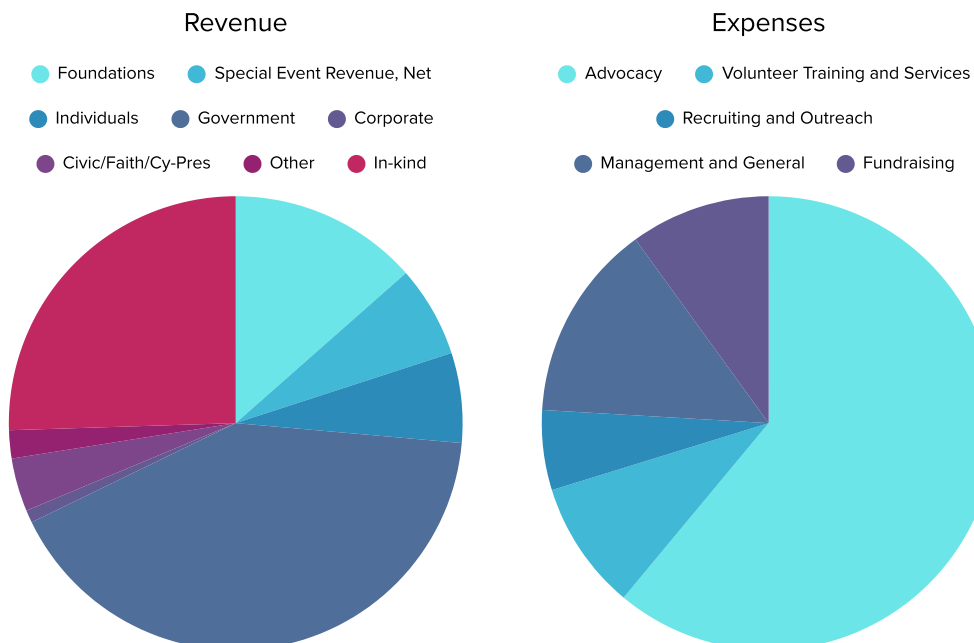

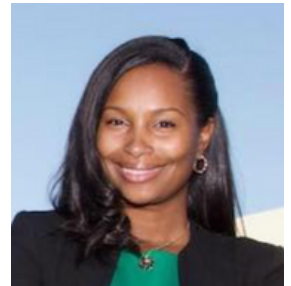

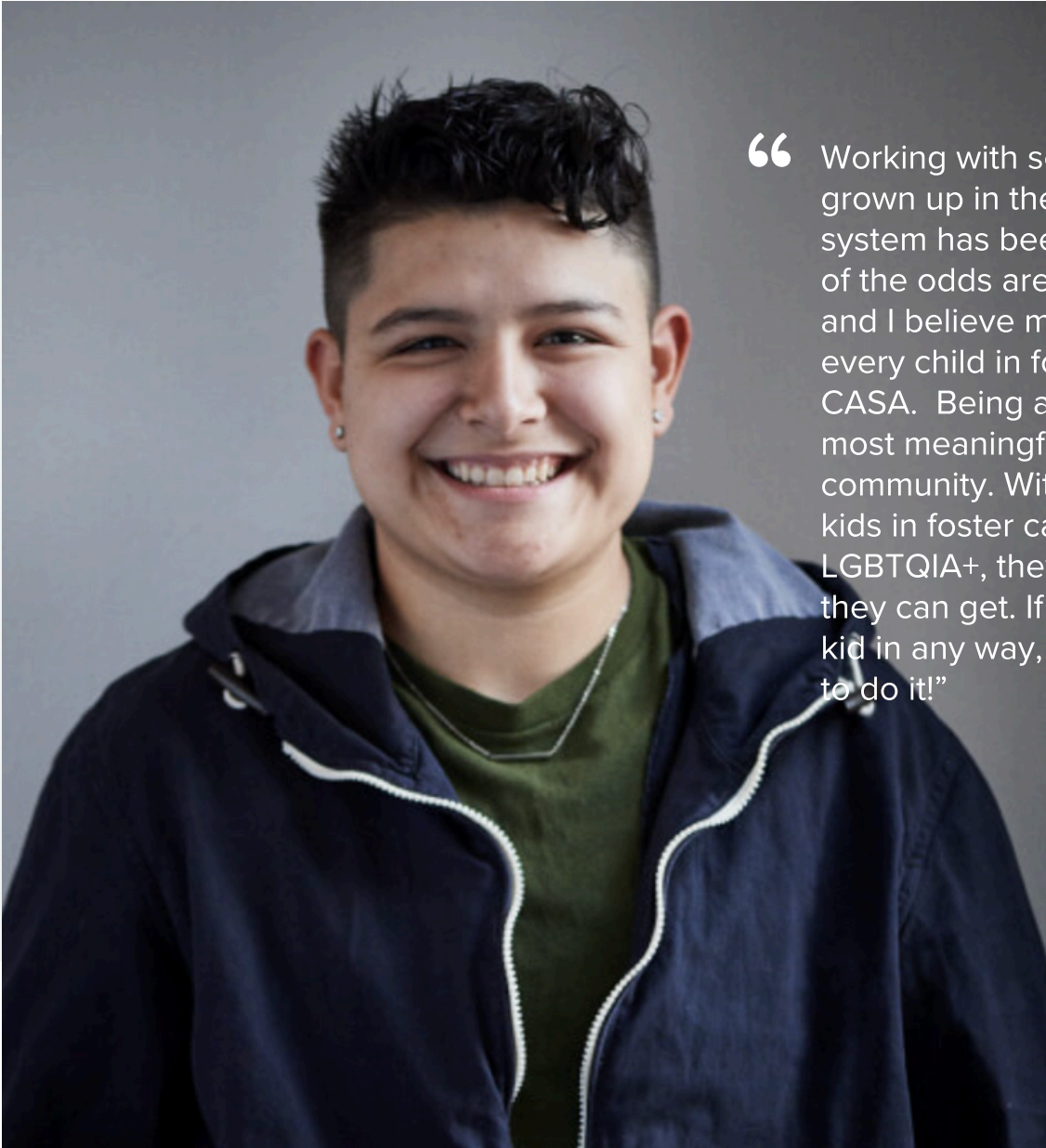
